



HOW TO PAINT

Heavy Grey Pants



This time, I'm going to paint gray pants with a heavy tone. I'm sorry that there's something wrong with these pictures and it's a little out of focus.

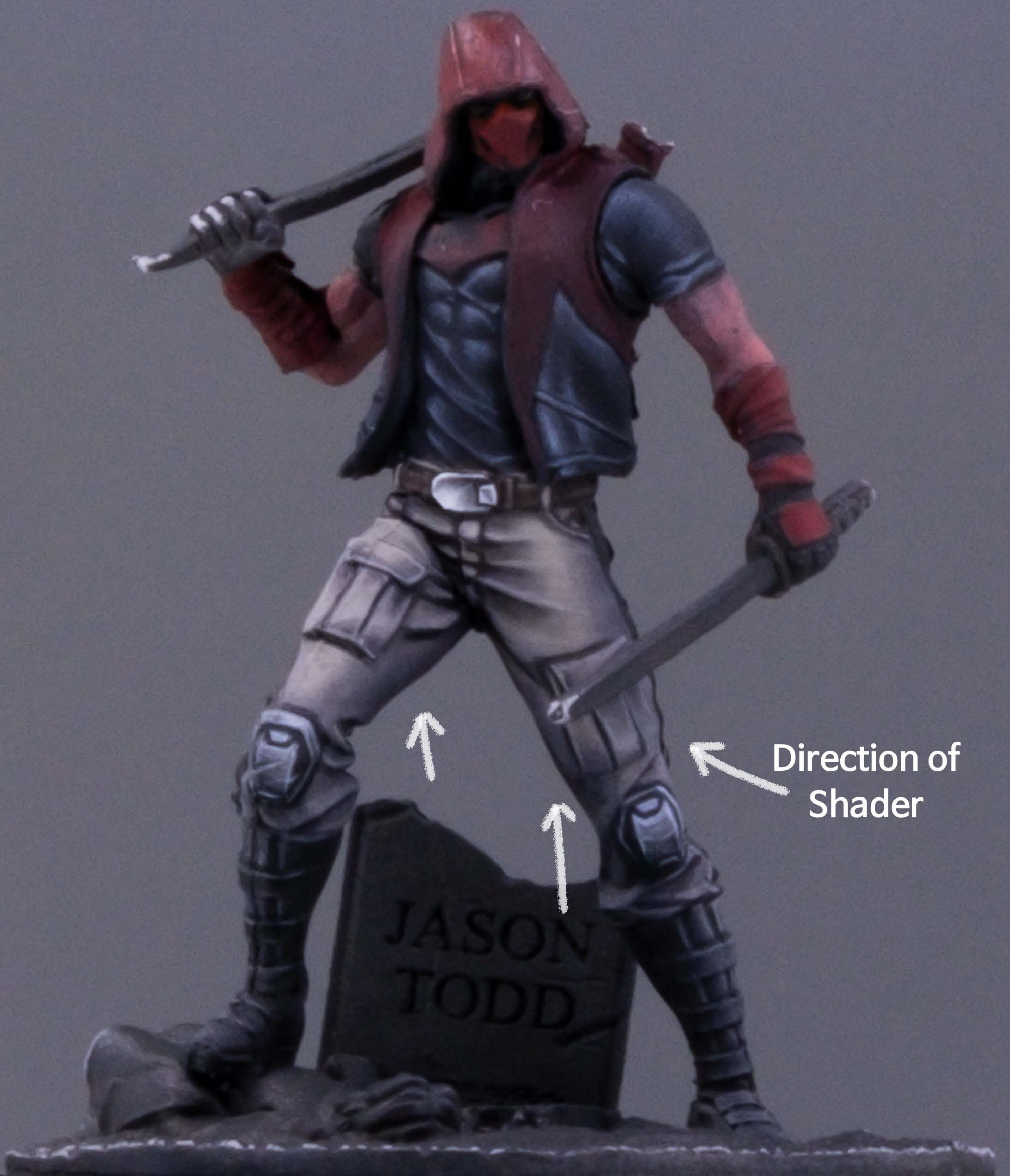
First, paint the entire pants with AK 3rd Tenbrous Gray. This paint is dark brown with a slight purple color, so it work well with later work.

Afterwards, the AK 3rd Warm Gray marks all areas that will be brightened.



Now dilute AK 3rd Tenbrous Gray + AK 3rd Warm Gray (1:1) and remove the boundaries using glazing techniques. Instead of making gradation as usual, apply it as if you're covering the shadow areas.

When this process is over, it becomes a pair of pants with a little bit of purple shadow like the picture above.



Next, dilute Ammo Mig Shader Ash Black and paint around the shadow direction. I painted it around the bottom right. As the beige color belongs to a bright color, it works as soon as you paint it 1-2 times and dry it. Compared to the previous photo, you can see that the shadow is much heavier and more natural.

After that, diluting the AK 3rd Warm Gray and glaze the part that receives the light 2-3 times.



Now use AK 3rd Warm Gray + AK 3rd Silver Gray (2:1) to highlight the wrinkles and edges of the clothes in the area where they are illuminated. Regular clothes are not glossy, so it's more natural to highlight them with a soft like this.

For the right leg with a strong shadow, use Warm Grey to highlight it.



The gray pants with a simple heavy color are done! If there is a part where you need to express the shadow strongly (like the inside of the wrinkles), use AK 3rd Tenebrous Gray. As I said before, this paint has a little bit of purple, so it goes well with the shadow made of Ash Black.
